All over the world people are increasingly becoming concerned about the destruction of forests and its effects on climate and the land .In India alone, as estimated, 1.3 million hectares of forest is being lost each year. The forests are cut down for mining projects, the making of dams and the planting of cash crops. The present Chipko movement was started in the 1970s in an effort to save the forests of Garwhal Himalaya in North India .Chipko means to embrace and on occasions men and women have literally hugged the trees and risked their lives to protect them from axe.

It was the Bishnoi community in Rajasthan who inspired the Chipko Movement. This sect believed in Non-Violence towards all living things including trees. About 300 years ago there was a ruler in Rajasthan who wanted to build a palace. He needed wood to fire the lime kilns. The women of Bishnoi community hugged the trees to prevent the wood cutters from cutting the sacred 'Khejri'trees. About 250 women died before the king repented of his act and made vow not to destroy the trees.
